Credits for Graduation

Students are required to earn 26 credits to graduate.

- 4.0 English
- 4.0 Social Studies, including 0.5 credit New Mexico History and 0.5 Geography
- 4.0 Mathematics (*including Algebra II*)
- 4.0 Science, including two laboratory sciences
- 1.0 World Language or Career Cluster or Workplace Readiness
- 1.0 Physical Education
- 0.5 Health (*starting with class of 2017*)
- 0.5 Fine Arts
- 0.5 Technology
- 6.5 Electives

Students are also required to have **one** of the following:

- 1.0 Advanced Placement (AP) credit, **or**
- 1.0 Dual enrollment (college level) credit, **or**
- 1.0 Distance learning (on-line) credit.

Diploma of Distinction

Requires completion of a full 28 credits with no grade lower than a C. Must include (2) AP credits. For a complete description of the Diploma of Distinction, please refer to the Program of Studies.
