Summer Reading for AP Government (12th grade)

Students need the original text, unabridged. If they wish to purchase the Federalist Papers book they may do so, but these four are fair game on the National Exam in 2019.

Martin Luther King, Letter From Birmingham Jail, full text

Pocket size copy of the Constitution, Bill of Rights and Declaration Of Independence.
